



OTHER SERVICES:

Parenting Partnerships networks with community organizations, businesses, schools, and faith based organizations to provide family life education. Collaborative Law Allied Professionals

Collaborative Law allows couples to divorce with dignity and offers an alternative to litigation. Allied Professionals support the use of a team approach. Allied professional facilitators have specialized training in family and child development, family mediation, and the collaborative law process. They assist facilitating communication and help parents understand the unique needs of their children, and the particular personal and developmental factors which should be considered in developing an effective parenting plan.

Co-parent Education and Family Stabilization

Parenting Partnerships offers **Children Caught in the Middle**, a four hour co-parenting education and family stabilization course that meets statutory guidelines mandated by many family courts. The first section of the course focuses on Adult Issues and the second focuses on Children's Issues. The course is offered in multiple locations in Dallas/Ft. Worth and Houston. This course is offered live and online.

Parenting Coordination:

Parenting Coordinators assist parents in resolving issues related to co-parenting/parenting or other family issues in high conflict law suits. Parenting coordination can be court ordered or agreed upon in mediation. It is considered an Alternative Dispute Resolution process.

Co-parenting Assistance

Co-parenting Assistance is a voluntary process where both parents agree to seek services that will assist them in restructuring and restabilizing their family during the divorce or separation process. It is useful in litigated divorce, and is a part of the Collaborative Law divorce in which lawyers and CFLEs work as a team to provide a strategy for achieving reasonable settlement while minimizing the damage to the family.

Parenting Plan Facilitation

Parenting Partnerships CFLEs use an educational model to teach appropriate co-parenting communication while assisting in the development of the parenting plan. This process works well in Collaborative Law and in Litigation. This process does not include financial settlements that are part of a final decree.

Family Mediation

All Parenting Partnerships CFLEs are experienced mediators. We use conference style mediation whenever possible. Our focus is to help parents make the best possible decisions for their family when restructuring and restabilizing.
